Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of **DURLAX INDIA PRIVATE LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31, 2020, and the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of Significant Accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In my opinion and to the best of my information and according to the explanations given to me, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2020, its profit (or Loss)* and cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

I have conducted audit in accordance with the standards on auditing specified under section 143 (10) of the Companies Act, 2013. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

The Company's board of directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134 (5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act. making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

NOTE 30:- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 General

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India under the historical cost convention on accrual basis. These financial statement have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards notified under section 133 of companies Act, 2013. All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the companies operating cycle and other criteria set out in the schedule III to the companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

1.2 Change in Accounting Policy:

There is a change in Accounting Policies in relation to charging of Depreciation as per Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013, on Property Plant & Equipment prospectively. Charging of Depreciation Method was changed from WDV Method to SLM Method for appropriate presentation and understanding for readers of Financial Statements of the Company. This Results in reduction of depreciation by Rs.2,82,16,805/- and resulting into reduction in loss by the same amount.

1.3 Use of Estimate

The preparation of the financial statement is in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to makes estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the difference between the actual result and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

1.4 Revenue Recognition

The Company recognizes the Revenue in accordance with the provisions of the AS-9 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, which requires that revenue should be recognized only when there is no uncertainty about the receipt of the same. Revenue recognition has been postponed to the extent of uncertainty attached with the recovery of the same. Interest Income is recognized on the basis of accrual system of accounting.

1.5 Property Plant and Equipment

Tangible Fixed Assets are carried at cost net of taxes / duties, credits availed, if any, less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any as per Companies Act, 2013.

1.6 Depreciation / Amortisation

There is a change in Accounting Policies in relation to charging of Depreciation as per Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013, on Property Plant & Equipment prospectively. Charging of Depreciation Method was changed from WDV Method to SLM Method for appropriate presentation and understanding for readers of Financial Statements of the Company. Depreciation is provided on a pro-rata basis on the Straight Line Method at the rates prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation on restatement of the useful life of the assets has been adjusted against General Reserve pursuant to the adoption of estimated useful life of the fixed assets as stipulated by Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

1.7 Inventories

Inventories are valued at Cost or NRV whichever is lower.

1.8 Retirement Benefits

There were no employee as on 31st March, 2020 who were eligible for Gratuity.

1.9 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are allocated to the acquisition or construction of qualified assets are capitalized as part of cost of such assets. A qualifying asset in one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue.

1.10 Foreign Current Transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are accounted for at equivalent rupee value incurred/earned in foreign currents. Assets/Liabilities at the year end are realigned at the applicable exchange rates or at forward contract rates, where applicable and variations are adjusted to the respective capital or revenue hands.

1.11 Taxes on Income

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefit admissible under the provision of the Income- Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax resulting from "timing difference" between taxable and accounting income is accounted for using the tax rates and laws that are enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets is recognised and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the asset will be realised in future.

1.12 Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period

1.13 Impairment

The Company assesses at each Balance Sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exist, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the assets or the cash generating unit to which the assets belong is less than their carrying amount; then the carrying amount thereof is reduced to its recoverable amount and such reduction is treated as Impairment Loss and is recognized in the statement of Profit & Loss.

If, at the balance sheet date there is an indication that a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exist, then the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at such reassessed recoverable amount.

1.14 Provision and contingent liabilities

The Company creates a provision when there is present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not require an outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

Provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. If it is no longer exist probable that an outflow of resources would be required to settle the obligation, the provision is reversed.

Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statement. However, contingent assets are assessed continually and if it is virtually certain that an inflow of economic benefit will arise, the asset and related income are recognised in the period in which the change occurs.

1.15 Previous year figures have been restated / reclassified to conform to the classification of the current year.
